Grant Application Process

DEADLINE: Applications must be received electronically by **December 31**.

Basic Information

1. Name, address, E-mail and phone number of the applicant(s).
2. Date of application.
3. Project Title.
4. Organization making the grant request if applicable.
5. Total amount of the grant request.

Description of the project

1. Outline the type of project, its goals and philosophy.
2. State the need the project will fulfill.
3. Indicate any target groups to be served.
4. Include any outline, samples, or other illustrations of the contents of the project.
5. Describe the qualifications of the person(s) or group(s) to undertake the project.
6. Provide the time frame for the project including the proposed completion date.

Financial Information

1. Provide a complete project budget.
2. List other funding sources (a) currently available, and (b) being requested.
3. Indicate the minimum grant needed to complete the project, and the date the funding would be needed.
